THE AFTER-DEATH GUIDE FOR FAMILIES

1. Make First Calls

If death was unexpected, call 911 immediately. If death was **expected**, call your loved one's doctor or palliative care nurse. If emergency services / doctor are unavailable, call your local coroner's office.




3. Call Funeral Home

Once the doctor is done their work, you can call the funeral home your loved one chose. If they didn't choose one, research funeral home options & set up meetings with ones that you feel can help you plan the service that your loved one wanted.


