What is a Funeral Celebrant?

Funeral celebrants are **ceremony** specialists who create & officiate personalized ceremonies that reflect the personality of the individual being honoured.

How Are Celebrant Ceremonies Different?

- They're secular-toned (non-religious).
- Focus on collaborating with your family to create an individualized ceremony. Pay careful attention to the
- personalization of ceremony elements. Provide you with a sense of control
- over ceremony content & knowing in advance how it will unfold.



What Does a "Personalized Ceremony" Mean?

A personalized ceremony will remind you of the

little things about your loved one that made them special. What they found meaningful, what made them happy & what mattered most to them.

How Does The Planning Process Work?

- As the ceremony outline emerges, family members may realize how they can
